## **WILDRIDINGS PRIMARY SCHOOL HOMEWORK POLICY**

The school recognises the importance of positive home school relationships. In order to encourage the children to gain the maximum benefit from their education it is the policy of this school to issue regular homework to all pupils from Reception to Year 6. Outlined below is the minimum amount of homework for each Year Group. Children will be given guidance for the completion of the homework tasks. Neat presentation is expected.

- Homework should be completed by the children with adult support.
- Homework will be looked over and any issues taken up with the children where appropriate.
- Homework will not be marked in depth.
- Children will be given folders for homework sheets. Homework should be sent and returned in it.
- Parent comments are welcomed.

### **Early years**

At least 10 minutes a day

- reading with parent /carer and complete reading diary
- learning words sent home
- recapping Jolly phonic sounds

### **Year 1**

At least 20 minutes a day

- reading with parent/carers and complete reading diary
- learning words/sounds sent home
- learning spellings (Spring term)
- occasional topic work
- occasional maths games/activities

### **Year 2**

At least 20 minutes a day

- reading with parent/carers and complete reading diary
- learning spellings
- maths games / activities
- occasional topic work

### **Year 3**

At least 30 minutes a day

- sharing reading with parent/carers and complete reading diary
- learning spellings/tables
- literacy x1
- big maths
- occasional topic work

### **Year 4**

At least 30 minutes a day

- sharing reading with parent/carers and complete reading diary
- learning spellings/tables
- big writing preparation
- big maths
- occasional topic work

### **Year 5**

At least 30 - 40 minutes a day

- sharing/discussing reading with parent/carers and complete reading diary
- learning spelling/tables
- big maths
- literacy x1
- maths x1
- completing unfinished work
- occasional topic work

### **Year 6**

At least 40 minutes a day

- sharing and discussing reading material with parent/carers and complete reading diary
- learning spellings/tables
- literacy x1
- maths x1
- Research project
- occasional topic work
- Completing unfinished work

### Sanctions

Children in KS2 who do not return homework twice in a term are given a lunchtime detention.
