Year 3	<p><b>Unit 1: French greetings with puppets.</b> Using puppets to practise greetings and learning how to introduce themselves.</p> <p><b>Unit 2: French adjectives of colour, size and shape.</b> Describing shapes using adjectives of colour and size.</p>	<p><b>Unit 3: French playground games.</b> This unit sees children count and read numbers one to twelve, ask how old someone is and answer the same question.</p> <p><b>Unit 4: In a French classroom</b> Responding to common classroom instructions through games.</p>	<p><b>Unit 5: French transport.</b> Using their detective skills to spot cognates, children learn new transport-related vocabulary.</p> <p><b>Unit 6: A circle of life in French</b> Using their dictionary skills to develop their animal vocabulary.</p>
Year 4	<p><b>Unit 1: Portraits – describing in French</b> Learning adjectives for describing appearance and personality.</p> <p><b>Unit 2: Clothes – getting dressed in France</b> Learning vocabulary to describe items of clothing, along with the different forms of the indefinite article.</p>	<p><b>Unit 3: French numbers, calendars and birthdays</b> Children learn French numbers 1-31, the days, months of the year and seasons.</p> <p><b>Unit 4: French weather and the water cycle</b> Learning phrases to describe the weather and vocabulary for the compass points.</p>	<p><b>Unit 5: French food</b> This unit introduces food vocabulary and revises numbers.</p> <p><b>Unit 6: French and the Eurovision Song Contest</b> Using the concept of the Eurovision Song Contest to inspire pupils when writing original songs in French.</p>
Year 5	<p><b>Unit 1: French monster pets</b> Reviewing adjective placement while exploring body part vocabulary.</p> <p><b>Unit 2: Space exploration – in French</b> Developing listening and language detective skills through a space theme.</p>	<p><b>Unit 3: Shopping in France</b> Pupils learn to construct high numbers in French, develop food-related vocabulary through games, stories and role-play.</p> <p><b>Unit 4: French-speaking world</b> Giving directions and discussing climate.</p>	<p><b>Unit 5: Verbs in a French week</b> Pupils identify the infinitive form of verbs, and subject pronouns.</p> <p><b>Unit 6: Meet my French family</b> This unit draws on vocabulary and grammar learned in Years 3, 4 and 5.</p>
Year 6	<p><b>Unit 1: French sport and the Olympics</b> Conjugating the verb aller – to go, identifying correct prepositions and learning sports vocabulary.</p> <p><b>Unit 2: French football champions</b> Practising language-learning strategies; developing reading, speaking and listening skills through a football-related theme.</p>	<p><b>Unit 3: In my French house</b> Pupils learn how to describe a house, the different rooms and who lives there. They also learn about prepositions.</p> <p><b>Unit 4: Planning a French holiday</b> The children learn to use a combination of present and near-future tenses, and become familiar with holiday-related vocabulary.</p>	<p><b>Unit 5: Visiting a town in France</b> Learning directional, transport and town vocabulary together with prepositional phrases, the children describe their journey to school, plan a trip to France and become tourist guides.</p>
